



BUY AMERICAN COMPLIANCE CHECKLIST

Public entities receiving State Energy Program (SEP) and Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (EECBG) funds provided by the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA) are required to provide and retain evidence that the iron, steel and manufactured goods used in grant projects comply with the Act's Buy American Provisions. These are outlined in Section 1605 of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (Public Law 111-5). A more thorough discussion of the requirements is included in Title 2, Part 176 of the Code of Federal Regulations (2CFR 176).
